We provide specialist care to over 2,000 patients and their families each year who are facing life-limiting illnesses from across North Devon.

Our services include community services, inpatient care in our Bedded Unit and a Supportive Care service that includes bereavement support. Our services are delivered across North Devon by a highly skilled team of specialists, covering 800 square miles, at no cost to our patients or their families.

Being referred to North Devon Hospice

You are most likely to be referred to the Hospice by another health professional who knows you. When a referral request is received, one of our Clinical Nurse Specialists will contact you to talk about how you feel the Hospice can support you and your family. This is a guide to the services we provide.

Community Services

Most of our patients are cared for in the comfort of their own homes through both our Clinical Nurse Specialists and Hospice to Home team. Through this care we can offer help with pain and symptom control as well as providing emotional, spiritual and practical support for the whole family.

Clinical Nurse Specialists

Our Clinical Nurse Specialists focus on helping to improve your quality of life. They can help with managing any symptoms you may be experiencing, making plans for future care and getting support

from other services that may be of benefit to you, including our community volunteers. They can also help with talking about the impact of your illness and how you may be feeling. With your permission, they will work in collaboration with your GP, District Nurse

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and other health professionals to ensure you get the best care available to you. They are happy to visit you at home, or anywhere else that you feel comfortable, at a time that is convenient to you and your family. How often one of our nurses visits you will depend on your needs at the time.

You can talk to our nurses at any point about how the hospice can best support you and your family. Even if your usual nurse is not available, there is always a member of the team available to offer support over the phone (during office hours).

Our Clinical Nurses can offer:

- Advice about managing symptoms
- Information and support
- Talking about planning your future care
- Accessing other services, including volunteers
- Support for you and family
- Financial information

Hospice to Home

We provide hands on end-of-life care in your own home to enable you to stay at home if this is your preference. The support provided can be a short-term intervention to help prevent a crisis from escalating or to avoid an acute admission. This service is available to patients who have been assessed by a healthcare professional and feel our service is appropriate to meet your needs.

Our Hospice to Home team look after patients and their carers who prefer to receive help at home. According to our availability we can often respond with a visit the same day as the referral. We offer support in the form of multiple day visits and night sits. We support our patients with symptom control, psychological support, personal care and practical help. We are specifically here for patients and their families who need more hands-on care and support towards the end-of-life.

Our healthcare support workers offer respite sits at night in patient homes which give families a valuable break.

Our Hospice to Home and Clinical Nurse Specialist teams work closely with GPs and other healthcare professionals ensuring that our patients have the highest level of care.

90% of our patients' preferred place of end-of-life care is at home. We try and ensure that, where possible, our patients are able to spend their final days at home rather in a hospital (or at our hospice, if that is their wish.)

All referrals to our Hospice to Home service are made on behalf of our patients by a healthcare professional.

Referrals can be made between 8.30am – 5pm, Monday to Friday by calling 01271 347246/7, or out-of-hours by calling 01392 822342. Referrals are accepted from all healthcare professionals.

Bedded Unit

We provide specialist palliative inpatient care for adults with complex problems associated with advanced progressive illnesses. This support is available to patients who have complex end-of-life care needs and require treatment for pain management or other distressing symptoms. We give this care 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, however it is not a long stay unit.

We offer accommodation in our seven room Bedded Unit. We have a high nurse to patient ratio, allowing us the opportunity to give dedicated support to patients with a variety of symptoms associated with a life-limiting illness.

We support our patients with symptom control and end-of-life care in our Bedded Unit. We aim to give our patients the care and support they need to make them comfortable. Around 60% of our patients are discharged after a short stay with us.

All requests for referrals to our Bedded Unit must be with the explicit agreement of the GP and/or relevant hospital consultant.

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Supportive Care Services

For patients and their families who are living with the knowledge that time might be short, the Supportive Care team offers a wide range of individual sessions and group workshops.

Together with each family, including children and grandchildren, we give space and time to explore what is important to them and discuss what may support their well-being and quality of life. Over the years, we have found that sometimes it is easier to talk more freely to someone who is not a family member and that being with people in a similar situation can really make a difference.

Individual sessions allow for confidential one-to-one support with counsellor trained staff. We also have a team of complementary therapists who provide a range of different therapies.

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We facilitate group activities and as we offer them in six week programmes, we are able to vary the content of each programme to meet the specific needs of the patients and their families that we have at that time. Past programmes have included well-being days, support groups for patients, support groups for carers and people who have been bereaved, 'Making Memories' workshops, mindfulness workshops, seated exercise, gardening, information sessions on how to talk to children, nutrition, coping with anxiety and breathlessness.

Supportive Care services can be accessed at our main hospice site at Deer Park in Barnstaple or our outreach centre, The Long House, in Holsworthy. Supportive Care is available to adult patients who have a limited life expectancy and are in the palliative stage of their disease. We support friends, relatives and colleagues of that patient before and after their death, for as long as it is helpful.



The bereavement service is also available to bereaved adults and children where a palliative care patient had been cared for outside North Devon.

Our Education Team

Our Education team supports our own clinical staff with training needs as well as other healthcare professionals, care home staff, GPs and healthcare students across North Devon. They help to develop skills and confidence in working with people facing life-limiting illnesses

We work alongside other healthcare professionals to ensure patients throughout North Devon receive the best end-of-life care, when they need it most. This includes offering our healthcare partners specialist training and educational opportunities.

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Where we offer our services

We have been providing care for over 35 years. The majority of our care is provided within people's own homes. In addition to the care and support we provide throughout the community, we have teams based at two locations in North Devon.

Deer Park, Barnstaple

Our main site is based on the outskirts of Barnstaple. Our patients and families can access a wide range of care and support services, including our 7 bedded in-patient unit.
